## Progress

In addition to having Attainment schools are also measured and held accountable for what progress children make from Key Stage 1 to the end of Key Stage 2.

The new measures for progress mean that if a school holds a progress score of 0, then that is in line with National. If a school has any negative (-) progress scores it means the children have not performed as well as they could have done and not made sufficient or expected progress. If a school has positive (+) progress scores it means that the children have made more than sufficient or expected progress.

You can see our progress scores above and we have already identified writing as an area for improvement during 2023-24
