
Through these drivers we explore values that are key to developing our pupils as positive citizens who care about others and the world around them:

Lateness and Attendance

Please ensure that your child arrives to school on time. Every minute lost is vital and many activities first thing in the morning are designed to go over previous learning and help children with any difficulties they have had with tricky concepts.

- Arrival in the morning after the time window will be classed as late.
- The day starts at 8.50am at TV and at 8.55am for BRJS (gates open at 8.45am)
- If your child arrives after half an hour of this start time, this is classed as an unauthorised half day absence.

Also a reminder that holidays should not be taken in school time. Children miss chunks of learning when they are not in school and this has a detrimental impact upon their knowledge and skills.

Our Attendance Policy, which is based upon Local Authority advice states: "If your child misses 3 days (6 sessions) of **unauthorised absence** over a 6 week rolling period, whether the unauthorised absence relates to a family holiday or is more general in

nature, the head teacher can ask the Local Authority to issue an Education Penalty Notice to each parent or carer for each child to whom persistent absence applies. The school can also request that the Local Authority issue an Education Penalty Notice when a child is persistently late and where they are signified as a 'U' in the attendance. A penalty notice is a suitable intervention in circumstances where the parent is judged capable of securing their child's regular punctuality and attendance but is not willing to take responsibility for doing so. This includes where families take a holiday during term time. In the vast majority of instances, penalty notices will be the last resort where all other efforts to address non-attendance or poor punctuality have failed."

We know that the vast majority of you take attendance at school very seriously, but we are aware of a growing number of cases where absence from school is becoming more prevalent. The governors and ourselves have always been very reluctant to issue penalty notices but we will consider fining for long or regular absence due to family holidays or any other regular unauthorised reason.

For your reference, here is the whole school attendance percentage for Autumn 1.

BRJS: Whole school attendance: 95% TV: Whole School attendance: 95%.


It will be fantastic to see this even higher next half term.
