<u>Guided Reading: 'Cosmic' by Frank Cottrell Boyce</u>




English:

Our English work will be focusing on the renowned English poet, playwright, and actor: William Shakespeare.

We'll be writing a narrative based on one of his most famous plays, Romeo & Juliet. Firstly, we'll learn all about the story by watching the 'Animated Tales' video. We'll then look at some Shakespearean lan-

guage and analyse the play's prologue. Then following the same main ideas from the play, we'll plan, draft and publish our own narratives.

In addition, we'll do an independent piece of writing: a biography of William Shakespeare.



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History/ Geography

Our history work will focus on the Tudor period of English history. We will practice our skills of chronology by using and creating timelines. In addition, we will develop our skills of enquiry and research by asking and answering questions. By the end of the unit we will have developed our knowledge of the Tudor Kings and Queens and the changes that happened to religion during the reign of Henry VIII.

In geography, we will use OS maps to locate features of Nottingham past and present, including the monasteries that were destroyed by Henry VIII


Science

Our topic for the 1st half term is forces where we will:

- explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object
- identify the effects of air resistance, water re-

sistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces

recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.



PE: We will start our term with learning some Tudor dance, linking with our history theme. We will imagine that we are at the court of Henry VIII, as well as practicing some traditional country dance steps.

Our PE specialist Mrs Fant will be continuing some work on gymnastics. Focusing on travel, balance and rolls using small pieces of apparatus. The children will create sequences of movements whilst practicing the quality of their moves.

RE/PSHE

In RE, we will be finding out about the range of religions that are practiced in Nottingham. We will be considering guestions of tolerance and respect and how these can be used to create a peaceful, harmonious community.

In PSHE we are exploring 'Dreams and Goals'. We will be learning about setting goals for our self and exploring how we can make a difference.

Computing



This term's computing topic is 'Exploring Presentations'. We will be creating a PowerPoint on Tudor monarchs, learning

different skills on how we can create an effective presentation.

Art

We will be taking inspiration from Hans Holbein and looking at Tudor portraits and the Tudor Rose



Music

This term, we will be using Charanga to learn about Jazz music
