Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the 24-25 academic year at the Trent-Rylands Federation. We hope you had a good summer break and spent lots of time with your family. We are looking forward to teaching your children and seeing them blossom throughout the year. We know that working closely with all of you is paramount and want to work in partnership with you throughout your child's time with us. We will be focusing on helping your child to be happy and settle into school life, be a great friend and learn lots along the way.

Start and End of School Day

Trent Vale Infant and Nursery School

Morning: - 8.50am – 12.00pm

Afternoon: - 1.00pm – 3.20pm

Children are expected to be in their classrooms when school starts at 8.50am. The class teacher will take the register as soon as the children are settled in their classroom.

The gates to the playground will be locked at 9.00am. Any child arriving after this time must enter the school at the main reception where they will be registered by a member of the office staff.

Pupils who are not present for registration will be marked as absent. If they arrive after the register has been submitted to the office but before 9.20 am they will be marked as present but late. Arrival after 9:20 will be marked as a half day's absence, indicated by a 'U' in the register.

Beeston Rylands Junior School

Morning: - 8.55am – 12.00pm (school opens for pupils from 8.45am)

Afternoon: - 1.00pm – 3.25pm

Children are expected to be in their classroom when school starts at 8.55am. The class teacher will take the register as soon as the children are settled in their classroom.

The gates to the school from the road will be locked at 9.00am. Any child arriving after this time must enter the school at the main reception where they will be registered by a member of the office staff.

Pupils who are not present for registration will be marked as absent. If they arrive after the register has been submitted to the office but before 9.25 am they will be marked as present but late. Arrival after 9:25 am will be marked as a half day's absence, indicated by a 'U' in the register.

To help you report a child's absence please use the Studybug app. This is our preferred method for you to advise us of your child's absence. Please get the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child's ill and unable to attend school.

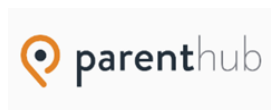
Top 3 reasons to use Studybugs

Communication with Staff

- Drop off time is always busy and teachers might not always have chance to talk with you. Headteachers /office staff will be available to talk with you, if you need to pass on any important information for the day, every morning on the school playground.
- Pop in, email or phone the school office as you need to.
- Please email or phone school if you need to speak to a member of staff. Staff will respond to emails within 5 working days. Whilst we understand that you are busy, please try not to email teachers late at night or at the weekend.

Communication with you via Parent Hub



We have changed the way we communicate with parents moving forward. This is via an app called Parent Hub. This app allows us to message you on a platform either individually or as part of a group or class. It enables you to keep all messages in one place rather than having to scroll through your text messages or emails.

You will need to download the app and follow @TrentVale/@BRJS to make sure you don't miss out on important communications from school.

Trent Vale are also using this app to pay for items and give consent for trips.

Attendance

We are really proud of all the families who are able to get their children to school on time and whose attendance is constantly high. Please see below the overall attendance so far for this academic year.

Overall attendance at **BRJS in 2023-24: 94.9%**

Overall attendance at **TV in 2023-24: 94.8%**

Nottinghamshire County Council's policy is to send parents and carers penalty notices (fines) should your child be absent or consistently late for 10 session (5 days) over a 6 week monitoring period. This means that any holidays in school time or persistent absence results in a fine.

Parents' Groups

We would like to thank the parent groups at both schools for the time spent organising events and helping us behind the scenes. They are busy planning events for the new school year and further information will be sent out separately.

At BRJS our children have enjoyed film nights, discos and other parent group events. The money raised has been used towards upgrading and developing our outside quad area to provide resources and storage for use during play and lunch times. The sensory garden pergola has been upgraded and now includes a seating area for children to use as a calming area for art and relaxation. A big thank you to Adrian Biddulph, Freebird Joinery, home and garden maintenance for their work and generous donation of additional wood which allowed us to afford to add the seating.



At Trent Vale, events over the last year have funded a new library, a sensory room and extra resources for the classrooms. Most recently, the Parent Group organised a fantastic summer fair which was enjoyed by the whole community and raised £936.73 for school funds.

Easyfundraising continues to provide quarterly payments to the federation; a total of £938.74 has been raised since we started.
