Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the Spring term at The Trent-Rylands Federation – we hope that you and your family have had a wonderful festive break. It's great to have all of the children back; they have settled back into school well after the holidays and have been excited to see their friends and teachers again. Each class has started to enjoy their new curriculum topics and the teachers have been busy organising lots of exciting enrichment activities for this term - we know that the children are going to absolutely love what we have in store.

We would like to welcome Miss Amie Draycott to our Nursery/F1 team. Amie joins us with a wealth of experience. She has settled in well, getting to know the nursery children and their parents.

Lateness and Attendance

It is important that if your child is going to make good progress both academically and socially, they attend school regularly and are on time - learning starts in school straight away. Thank you to all our parents who get their children to school on time every day.

As a reminder:

- Arrival in the morning after the time window will be classed as late.
- The day starts at 8.50am at TV and at 8.55am for BRJS (gates open at 8.45am)
- If your child arrives after half an hour of this start time, this is classed as an unauthorised half day absence. At TV this is after 9.20 am and at BRJS this is at 9.25 am. This has a significant impact on learning.

Holidays should **not be** taken in school time. Children miss chunks of learning when they are not in school and this has a detrimental impact upon their knowledge and skills. Prior to the break, we informed you that, from January 2025, the Trent-Rylands Federation will be referring requests for unauthorised leave to the authority who will issue Penalty Notices.

For your reference, here is the whole school attendance since we started school in September:

BRJS: Whole school attendance: 93.8% TV: Whole School attendance: 94.5%

This percentage has continued to be similar from Autumn 1 but we would really like to see this climb.

We know, due to the time of year, there are bugs and illness about, but please do everything you can to make sure that your child is in school unless they are very unwell, have a temperature or an upset stomach. If they become unwell at school, we will always call you if they need to go home. We know that sometimes being in school with their friends can help them feel a bit better. Please do check we have up to date contact details especially if these have changed recently. If you need to report an absence, we would prefer you to let us know via the Study Bugs App (https://studybugs.com/about/parents) but if this is unavailable, please email the relevant school office or leave a message on the answer phone.

Reading Morning

We will be having reading mornings for parents of children at Trent Vale. We have allocated 2 dates for this term (please see below). Feedback, and the atmosphere within school during these 2 events, is always positive and both children and parents gain a lot from these sessions. For parents who have not stopped for these mornings before, make a note of the dates in your diary so you can stop and read with your child for 15 minutes in the morning at drop off time.

Thank You / Community Events

Last term was busy to say the least. In the build up to Christmas all our children were involved in community-based activities which were enjoyed by everyone.

Christingle

To start the Christmas festivities, both schools attended the Chilwell Family Christingle at St John's Church in Beeston in early December. We received many positive comments from members of our school community; the children sang beautifully and we were proud of them. Thank you to Ms Jones, Mrs Mason and Miss Smith for leading this and ensuring the children had the opportunity for this community-based activity.

Reindeer Dash

The children and staff at Trent Vale loved taking part in the Reindeer Dash again this year. The children wore antlers and ran laps round the playground to raise money for the Treetops Hospice Children's Bereavement Centre. A total of £274.03 was raised – thank you for your generosity and support for this local charity.

Christmas Carols

A local In-Home Care Provider had their Christmas Party at the Boat and Horses and were entertained by children in Beech and Lilac class. Our Reception children sang a selection of songs from their Christmas Nativity and the residents joined in with everyone being impressed by the children's singing and enthusiasm.

Parents' Groups

We would like to thank the parents' groups for the time spent organising events and for helping us behind the scenes. BRJS
